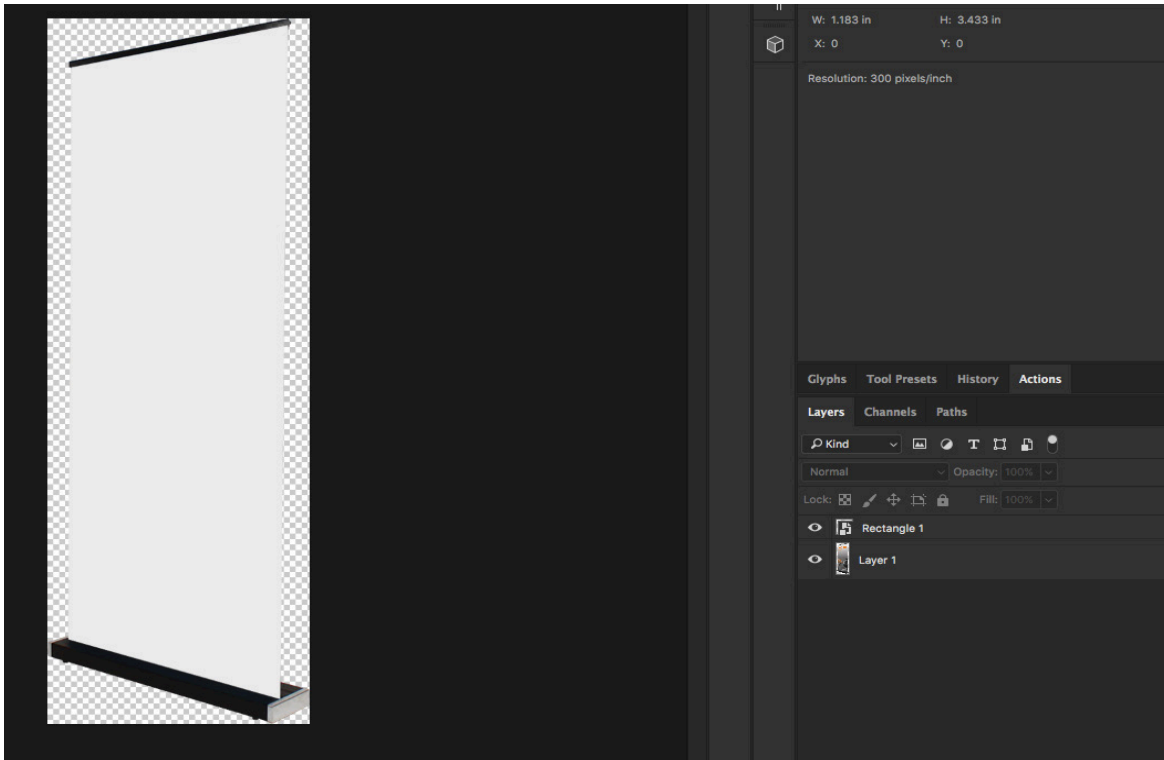


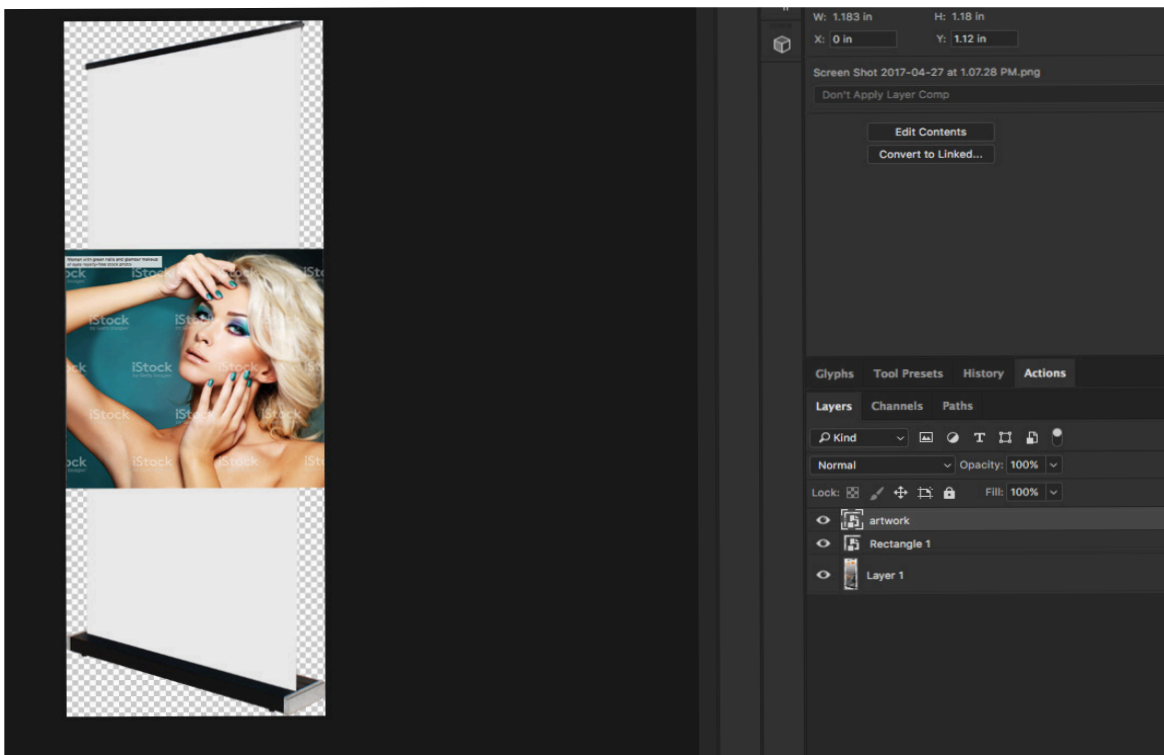
STEP 1:

Open blank rendering in Photoshop. No other programs should be used for this type of work! Before you start make sure the resolution of the file is 300dpi and the color settings are correct based on what this artwork will be used for. CMYK for Print or RGB for web. In this file there should be two layers already in it. Layer 1 is the product. Rectangle 1 is the blank section where the artwork will be placed.



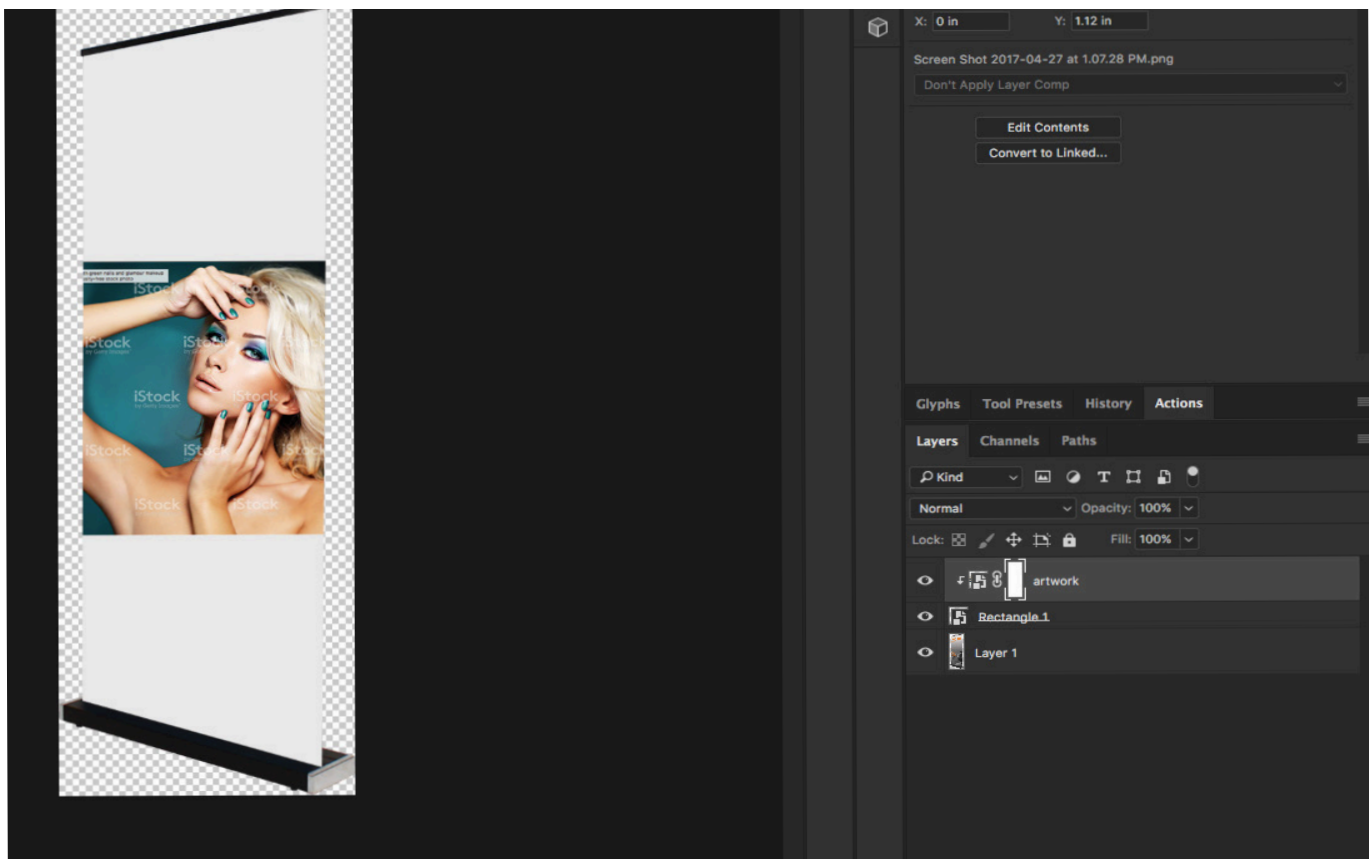
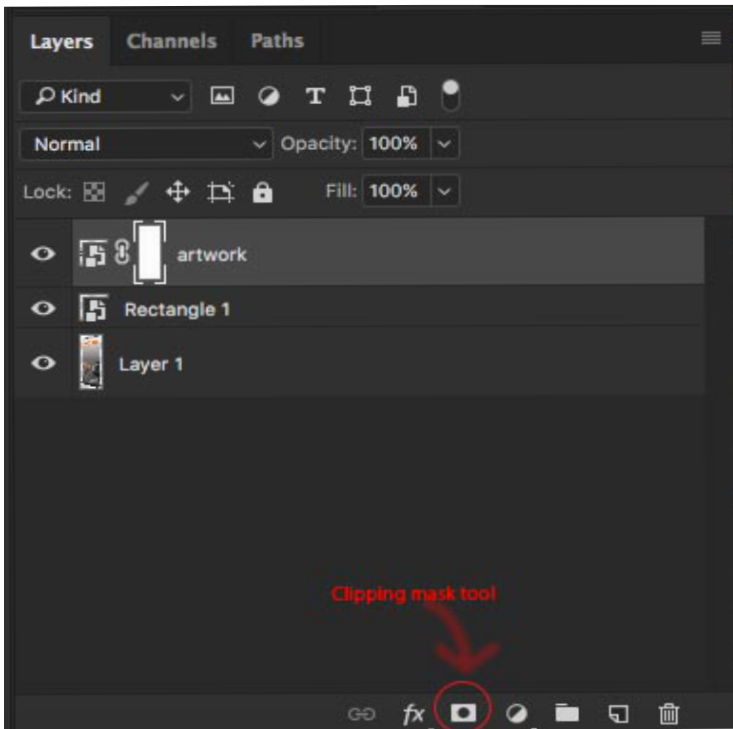
STEP 2:

Drag in your artwork. This should be the top layer (name it artwork so it is easy to find). As you can see the artwork cannot be simply dragged and dropped to fit the product.



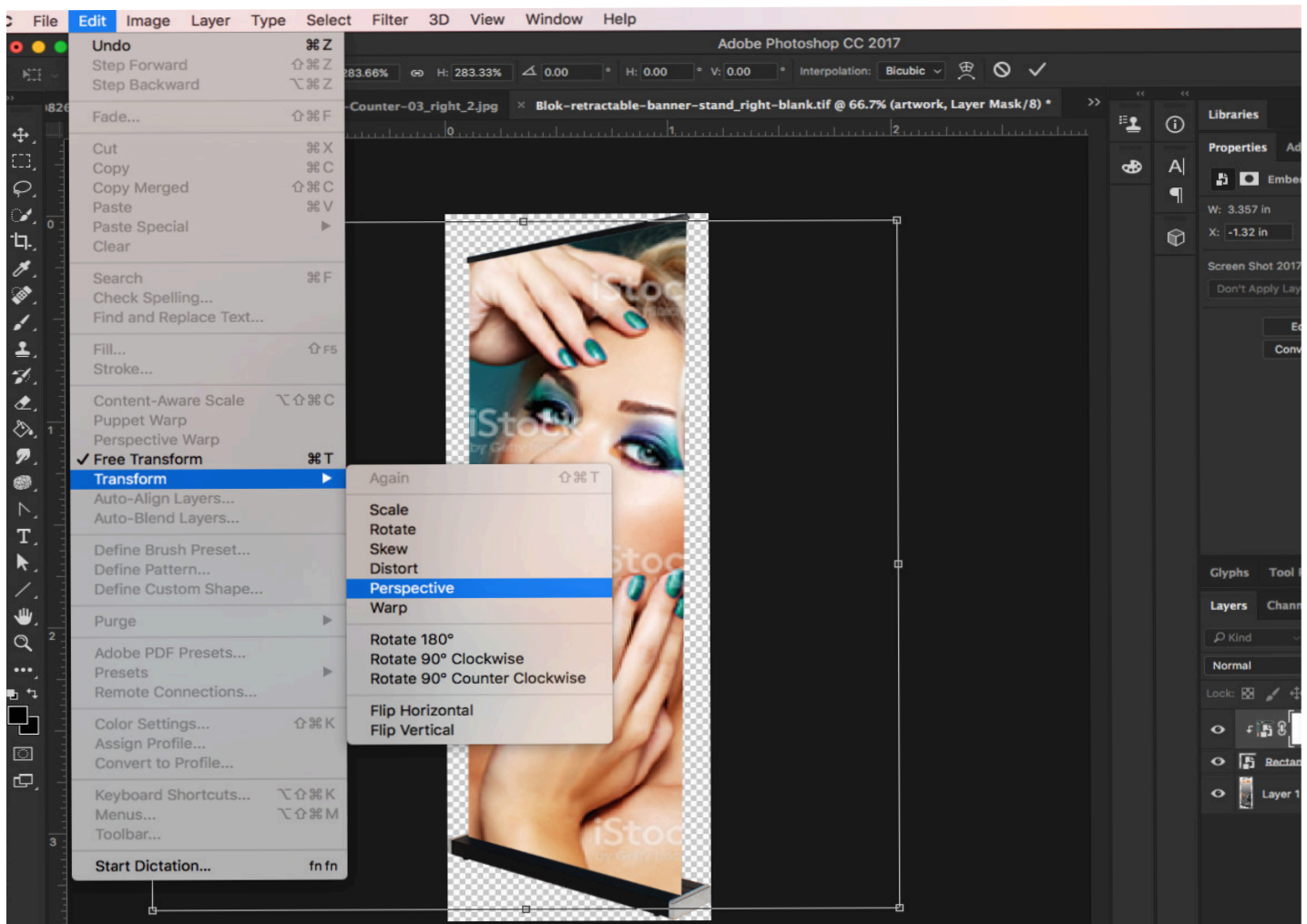
STEP 3:

In your layers panel. You will want to click on the artwork layer and create a clipping mask (circled in red) Once you create a clipping mask you will want to click the artwork layer once again, hold down the option (alt) key and click the layer. The layer should appear the way it does on the screen shot below. Once you've done this you can see that the art now fits into the boundaries of the blank area.



STEP 4:

You will then scale your artwork to fit to fit the product. However, you may notice that your artwork's perspective is off based on the angle of the product. To adjust the artwork's perspective so that it aligns with the angle of the product you will need to go to Edit>transform>perspective and adjust accordingly (seen in the second image below).



FINAL:

Artwork should be clipped to the boundaries of the blank layer and should fit the angle in which the product is facing. Once this is finished save to the format you will need for this image.
